# The 27th Annual ET & WNC RR HS Convention

The 27<sup>th</sup> annual Convention of the East Tennessee & Western North Carolina Railroad Historical Society will be held June 26-28, 2015 in Johnson City, Tennessee. Your Board of Directors are once again planning some new and exciting events for this year.

On Friday June 26, we will once again convene at the Carnegie Hotel in Johnson City. The kick off will be at 3 pm with registration. At 5pm the Business meeting will start. Dinner will be held at 7pm and once again there will be a special guest speaker. Please note we have been promised both rooms this year so we will not be as cramped as last year. Also this will allow us to bring memorabilia or other railroad items to share. Saturday will start at 8am with a guided walk on the Tweetsie Trail. The tour will begin at the Carnegie with a brief lecture from Chris Ford with aerial maps. Then a caravan will head out going by the Clinchfield and ET Station. Please plan ahead and carpool as much as possible. The caravan will stop at Alabama Street Trail Head. There will be a brief intro to the Engine house and then a walk over the trail. This is a 2 mile round trip. Please wear comfortable shoes and layer clothing for the weather. Remember it is easier to remove clothing layers than put on. The George L Carter Museum will be open from 10 am to 3 pm on the campus of ETSU. Don't worry. You will have plenty of time to take the walk and enjoy the museum if you choose.

This year at Tweetsie events will happen a little differently. The Management at Tweetsie is going to keep the park open till 9 pm this year, so therefore we will not have the park to ourselves. The park will open up to the Society Membership at 3pm and the membership will have the opportunity to experience the entire park plus a special viewing of #12 if it is not operating that day. The Board of Directors of the ET & WNC RR Historical Society met Saturday, March 28<sup>th</sup>, 2015 at the campus of ETSU in Johnson City.

Of main focus for the meeting was the discussion of the upcoming convention to be held in Johnson City, TN. A set cost of \$49.00 per person will cover 2 meals, Tweetsie entrance in to the park, a walk and talk at the Tweetsie Trail, train ride at the Gorge on Sunday, and cost of the meeting rooms at the Carnegie Hotel. The business meeting will begin at 5 pm and dinner/ speaker at 7 pm.

It was moved and seconded to appoint Jane Brady as interim Secretary. As stated in the by-laws, Jane will be confirmed to the office at the next annual business meeting. This coming year will be the elections of Vice President and Treasurer. If you have a nomination please email a board member with that nomination.

Board of Directors Meeting

The advisory committee headed up by Joel Shipley, has met and discussed pros and cons for association with the George L. Carter Museum. Joel will bring a memorandum of understanding to the membership at the business meeting and then a vote will be held to proceed with association or not to proceed with association.
