The 28th Annual Convention Will Be Held June 3-5 2016

WOW!! What a fabulous convention the East Tennessee & Western North Carolina Railroad Historical Society Board of Directors has planned for you this year. You will notice that our convention is earlier in June than usual. We are taking advantage of a model train show to be held at the Mini-Dome on the East Tennessee State University campus. Since many of you are model train buffs as well as historical train lovers, we want you to be able to take advantage of both.

Our Vice-President, Jerry Turbyfill, has planned an extra special experience for us. In cooperation with the George L. Carter Museum, Mr. Chris Robbins of the Tweetsie Railroad, the North Carolina Wildlife Commission, the Doe River Gorge Christian Ministry, and the Linville Depot, Jerry has arranged three days of historical memories.

Our convention will begin Friday night, June 3rd at 5:00 pm at the Carnegie Hotel in Johnson City, Tennessee. Supper will follow the business meeting. Dean Smith of Rolla, Missouri will be our

guest speaker. He will share his expertise on modeling the ET&WNC Railroad.

Saturday morning our members will have several choices of activities. At 9:00 am, in the Carnegie main meeting room and in preparation for the afternoon tour, Chris Ford will give a brief lecture on the workings of the Cranberry Mine. Convention attendees will also have the choice of attending the model train show at the Mini-Dome, touring the George L. Carter Railroad Museum, or walking some of the Tweetsie Trail. The model train show will be open from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm on Friday and Saturday. Admission is five dollars. The George L. Carter Railroad museum, also on the ETSU campus, is open from 10:00 am to 5:00 pm. Construction of the ET&WNC scale model layout continues its fantastic progress.

From 1:00 to 4:00 pm, our President, Chris Ford, and a member of the North Carolina Wildlife Commission will be co-hosting a limited tour of the Cranberry mines. This tour promises to share the role that the ET&WNC Railroad played in the production of iron in this region of North Carolina. You will be asked to sign a waiver releasing the Society in case of accidents.

Later, we will be traveling to Blowing Rock, North Carolina to enjoy our annual train ride at the Tweetsie Rail-

road. Supper will feature Daniel Boone Inn's famous Southern fried chicken and country ham.

Sunday morning, from 9:45 am to noon, will find us at Doe River Gorge for our annual train ride up to Pardee Point. After lunch on your own, the Linville Depot in Newland, North Carolina will be our final destination for this convention. This much loved depot will be celebrating its grand opening after years of renovation. It will be 100 next year!
